2 Timothy 4:1-5 ¹I SOLEMNLY charge *you* in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by His appearing and His kingdom: ²preach the word; be ready in season *and* out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort, with great patience and instruction. ³For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but *wanting* to have their ears tickled, they will accumulate for themselves teachers in accordance to their own desires; ⁴and will turn away their ears from the truth, and will turn aside to myths. ⁵But you, be sober in all things, endure hardship, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry.

1. Pastors should be most concerned what God thinks.

2 Timothy 4:1-5 ¹I SOLEMNLY charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by His appearing and His kingdom:

2. We are to preach the word even when it's unpopular.

²preach the word; be ready in season and out of season;

Nehemiah 8:8 They read from the book, from the law of God, translating to give the sense so that they understood the reading.

Read it, Translated it = Understanding

3. The tone must be balanced with positive and negative exhortations.

Principles regarding the form of preaching.

A. An effective message has very little to do with style, charisma, or personality.

<u>2 Corinthians 10:10</u> For they say, "His letters are weighty and strong, but his personal presence is unimpressive, and his speech is contemptible."

b. Preaching can become ineffective if the goal is to be entertaining.

1 Corinthians 1:17 For Christ did not send me to baptize, but to preach the gospel not in cleverness of speech, that the cross of Christ should not be made void.

1 Corinthians 2:4-5 ⁴And my message and my preaching were not in persuasive words of wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power, ⁵that your faith should not rest on the wisdom of men, but on the power of God.

4. Never compromise in difficult times

Acts 6:1-4 ¹Now at this time while the disciples were increasing in number, a complaint arose on the part of the Hellenistic Jews against the native Hebrews, because their widows were being overlooked in the daily serving of food. ²And the twelve summoned the congregation of the disciples and said, "It is not desirable for us to neglect the word of God in order to serve tables. ³"But select from among you, brethren, seven men of good reputation, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may put in charge of this task. ⁴"But we will devote ourselves to prayer, and to the ministry of the word."

E. The preaching of the Word should be geared toward not unbelievers.

Ephesians 4:11-16 ¹¹And He gave some as apostles, and some as prophets, and some as evangelists, and some as pastors and teachers, ¹²for the equipping of the saints for the work of service, to the building up of the body of Christ; ¹³until we all attain to the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a mature man, to the measure of the stature which belongs to the fulness of Christ.

What are the benefits to the body? (1) Solid preaching the congregation from becoming victims to the deception of false teaching. ¹⁴As a result, we are no longer to be children, tossed here and there by waves, and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, by craftiness in deceitful scheming; Immature congregations are most vulnerable to false teachers. (2) Solid preaching the church up in love. 15but speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in all aspects into Him, who is the head, even Christ, ¹⁶from whom the whole body, being fitted and held together by that which every joint supplies, according to the proper working
