The Arian Heresy

- The legacy of Origen in the East
 - Alexandria emphasizes Jesus as eternal Son of God
 - Antioch sees Christ as somehow 'less than' the Father
 - Both influenced by Greek philosophy to take God's immutability (or impassibility) to the extreme (Mal. 3:6; Heb. 13:8; Ja. 1:17)
- Arianism
 - Arius accuses his bishop, Alexander, of Sabellianism (modalism) and teaches that the Logos is a created being→how/why?
 - Salvation is at stake!
 - Does the union of divine with human saves? (Recapitulation theory)
 - Is Christ our moral example?
