 First, there is a progression from God's glory to His

Rev. 6:12–17 —I looked when He broke the sixth seal, and there was a great earthquake; and the sun became black as sackcloth made of hair, and the whole moon became like blood; ¹³ and the stars of the sky fell to the earth, as a fig tree casts its unripe figs when shaken by a great wind. ¹⁴The sky was split apart like a scroll when it is rolled up, and every mountain and island were moved out of their places. ¹⁵Then the kings of the earth and the great men and the commanders and the rich and the strong and every slave and free man hid themselves in the caves and among the rocks of the mountains; ¹⁶ and they *said to the mountains and to the rocks, "Fall on us and hide us from the presence of Him who sits on the throne, and from the wrath of the Lamb; ¹⁷ for the great day of their wrath has come, and who is able to stand?"

Habakkuk'	s in the Face of Suffering (vv16–19)
o Haba	kkuk addresses his response to not just this vision, but his whole
enco	unter with God.
o He is	floored by multiple realities he has just seen/heard:
•	A terrifying vision of his Creator coming to judge his enemies
•	The reality that Israel was going to be judged too
=	The truth that his faithfulness wasn't going to save him from the
	painful circumstances
•	The fact that all he can do now is wait for it to happen
o There	e will be escalating economic disasters from invasion, YET he will
find j	oy in God.
•	He gets the main point of God's message: It's NOT about
•	His faithfulness will not save him from earthly disasters, BUT it is
	the guarantee that he will inherit life that will outweigh them.
•	Because of that life, God will him
	to face anything.
