Acts 16:26 and suddenly there came a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison house were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were unfastened.

Why does God use earthquakes?

- 1. To put His power on display
- 2. To mark or punctuate significant events

"and" - Conjunction

"so that" (purpose)

There were only four effects: (selective shaking)

- 1. It shook the "foundations" of the prison
- 2. It opened all the "doors" (more than one)
- 3. It unfastened everyone's "chains"

There were at least three spiritual affects:

- 1. It confirmed to Paul and Silas that God was with them.
- 2. It caused the prisoners to connect God to Paul / Silas
- 3. It not only caused the jailer to awake from his sleep, but it also helped awaken him spiritually to his need for salvation

Miracles were signs pointing to God.

27 When the jailer awoke and saw the prison doors opened, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, supposing that the prisoners had escaped.

28 But Paul cried out with a loud voice, saying, "Do not harm yourself, for we are all here!"

29 And he called for lights and rushed in, and trembling with fear he fell down before Paul and Silas,

30 and after he brought them out, he said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?"

31 They said, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household."

Principles of salvation:

- 1. Everyone who comes to saving faith must ask themselves that same question.
- 2. Everyone who comes to this point has come under the conviction of the Holy Spirit.
