Removal of Wickedness

Passage: Zech. 5

The Eight Visions of Zechariah's Second Prophecy

- 1. The Night Patrol: Israel's judgment is over, and God never forgot about them.
- 2. The Four Horns: Israel's tormentors will be judged.
- 3. The Measuring Line: Jerusalem will be rebuilt into a multiethnic capital where God will dwell among His people.
- 4. The Filthy Priest: God is the One Who sanctifies priests to represent Israel, but one day, an Ultimate Priest will come to represent ALL God's people.
- 5. The Golden Lampstand & the Olive Trees: God works through His chosen leaders to build into His people so they will testify to Himself.

The Message: Sinners will be removed before the Kingdom comes, so only the truly faithful will experience all the blessings promised to Israel.

	gender (cf. Prov. 8)
•	Heavy lead weight necessary to keep her from escaping

•	God has it sent away to prevent wickedness from polluting the
	land in the Kingdom
•	Flying women probably just a parallel to woman in ephah
o The	significance of
-	The region where Babylon is found
•	Site of the Tower of Babel (cf. Gen. 11)
=	Babylon becomes symbolic capital of world opposition to God (cf.
	Rev. 17–18)
o Why	it goes there
•	Wickedness can be worshipped by those submitted to it instead
	of polluting God's people any further

- God's people must be free of wickedness in the Kingdom, yet it will still arise again before the final judgment (cf. Rev. 20)
- God's design has always been for His people to be holy (cf. Lev.)
- This pictures the fulfilment of the scapegoat (cf. Lev 16)

The Message: In the Kingdom, not only will sinners be removed, but wickedness will also be contained and removed.
