Summary of 1:3–12:

- Our 'new begetting' gives us immeasurable blessings we can look forward to in the end.
- That future hope enables us to endure any suffering in the meantime because trials prove our faith is real and because proven faith brings Christ the most glory.
- Christ's glory is our chief motivation if we truly love Him.

- 1. Fix your hope completely on the grace to be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ.
- 2. Be holy in all your behavior.
