Text: Acts 17:1-6 **Date:** Dec 1, 2024

Acts 17:6 ... "These men who have **upset the world** have come here also;

Four virtues that make high-impact Christians:

1.	from	conviction

Acts 17:1–10 Now when they had traveled through Amphipolis and Apollonia, they came to Thessalonica, where there was a synagogue of the Jews.

Luke stayed behind - The pronoun "we" is replaced by "they"

Proverbs 29:25 The fear of man brings a snare, But he who trusts in the Lord will be exalted.

Matthew 28:19–20 "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

Joshua 1:9 "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous! Do not tremble or be dismayed, for the Lord your **God is with you wherever you go.**"

2 And according to Paul's custom, he went to them, and for three Sabbaths reasoned with them from the Scriptures, 3 explaining and giving evidence that the Christ had to suffer and rise again from the dead, and saying, "This Jesus whom I am proclaiming to you is the Christ."

"three Sabbaths"

It seems plausible they stayed more that three weeks.

- 1. According to Phil. 4:15-16 the Philippian church sent money to Paul at least twice during this visit.
- 2. According to 1 Thess 2:1-7 Paul supported himself by manual labor. That might suggest a longer stay.
- 3. It was during his stay in Thessalonica where Paul worked night and day that Paul wrote 1 & 2 Thess.

Paul's method of evangelism is marked off by three verbs:

Verb # 1 - "reasoned" [dialegomai] -

1 Peter 3:15 but sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts, always being ready to make a **defense** (apologetic) to everyone who asks you to give an account for the hope that is in you, yet with gentleness and reverence;

Reasoning was Paul's pattern of witnessing.

- In Athens (17:17)
- In Corinth (18:4)
- In Ephesus (18:19; 19:8, 9)
- In Troas (20:7, 9)
- In Caesarea (24:25)

"from the Scriptures"

Matthew 16:19 (ANT) — 19 I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; and whatever you bind (declare to be improper and unlawful) on earth must be **what is already bound in heaven**; and whatever you loose (declare lawful) on earth must be **what is already loosed in heaven**.

Verb # 2 - "explaining" [dianoigo] -

Mk 7:34 - Jesus opens the hears of a deaf man Lk 24:31 - Jesus opened the eyes o two men Acts 7:56 - Stephen saw heaven open up

Acts 16:14 A woman named Lydia, from the city of Thyatira, a seller of purple fabrics, a worshiper of God, was **listening**; and the Lord **opened** her heart to respond to **the things spoken by Paul.**

Verb # 3 - "giving evidence" [paratithemai] -

4 And some of them were persuaded and joined Paul and Silas, along with a large number of the God-fearing Greeks and a number of the leading women.

5 But the Jews, becoming jealous and taking along some wicked men from the market place, formed a mob and set the city in an uproar; and attacking the house of Jason, they were seeking to bring them out to the people.

6 When they did not find them, they began dragging Jason and some brethren before the city authorities, shouting, "These men who have upset the world have come here also;

"upset the world" (upset) [anastatoō] -

Acts 24:5 "For we have found this man a real pest and a fellow who stirs up dissension among all the Jews throughout the world, and a ringleader of the sect of the Nazarenes.

1 Peter 2:6–8 For this is contained in Scripture: "Behold, I lay in Zion a choice stone, a precious corner stone, And he who believes in Him will not be disappointed." 7 This precious value, then, is for you who believe; but for those who disbelieve, "The stone which the builders **rejected**, This became the very corner stone," 8 and, "A stone of **stumbling** and a rock of **offense**"; for they stumble because they are disobedient to the word, and to this doom they were also appointed.
