- The ______ Who Brings Peace (vv9–10)
 - Israel's protection and peace will be given when her King arrives in this manner.
 - O He will be:
 - Just
 - Endowed with salvation
 - Humble
 - Mounted on a donkey
 - His peace will be so complete that weapons of way will no longer be necessary, and Israel will be reunited.

Is. 2:4 – And He will judge between the nations,
 And will render decisions for many peoples;
 And they will hammer their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks.

Nation will not lift up sword against nation, And never again will they learn war.

<u>Is. 11:6</u> – And the wolf will dwell with the lamb, And the leopard will lie down with the young goat, And the calf and the young lion and the fatling together; And a little boy will lead them.

This arrival is quoted in the Gospels.

<u>Matt. 21:1–7</u> – When they had approached Jerusalem and had come to Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, ²saying to them, "Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied there and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to Me. ³If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord has need of them,' and immediately he will send them." ⁴This took place to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet:

⁵"Say to the daughter of Zion,

'Behold your King is coming to you,

Gentle, and mounted on a donkey,

Even on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden."

⁶The disciples went and did just as Jesus had instructed them, ⁷and brought the donkey and the colt, and laid their coats on them; and He sat on the coats. (cf. John 12:12-16)

Luke 19:41–44 — When He approached Jerusalem, He saw the city and wept over it, ⁴²saying, "If you had known in this day, even you, the things which make for peace! But now they have been hidden from your eyes. ⁴³For the days will come upon you when your enemies will throw up a barricade against you, and surround you and hem you in on every side, ⁴⁴and they will level you to the ground and your children within you, and they will not leave in you one stone upon another, **because** you did not recognize the time of your visitation."

 Verse 9 describes Christ's first advent when He arrived and offered to bring peace, and verse 10 describes His second advent when He will arrive and actually implement that peace.
