- The mourning in v11 most likely refers to Josiah's death at
   Megiddo and the mourning that followed (cf. 2 Chron. 35:20–27).

<u>2 Kings 23:25</u> – Before him there was no king like him who turned to the Lord with all his heart and with all his soul and with all his might, according to all the law of Moses; nor did any like him arise after him.

- The culpability will be felt at all levels of society.

Rom. 11:25–27 – For I do not want you, brethren, to be uninformed of this mystery—so that you will not be wise in your own estimation—that a partial hardening has happened to Israel until the fullness of the Gentiles has come in; <sup>26</sup> and so all Israel will be saved; just as it is written, "The Deliverer will come from Zion, He will remove ungodliness from Jacob."

27"This is My covenant with them,

 To enjoy God's deliverance from physical threats and enjoy physical blessings, they must be ready to repent in mourning over their Messiah's death.
